From the Pastor

Do you have a special place that you like to visit again and again? Have you ever said: "I would like to go back there again." A few weeks ago, my family took a cruise to Key West and the Bahamas. And guess what? We all said we wanted to go back. Maybe you have had a similar experience when you went to the park, or to the beach, or to Grandma's house and everyone shouted out: "When can we go back?" When this occurs, you know everyone had a good time.

The Old Testament Reading for Ash Wednesday this year is Joel 2:1-2, 12-17. Verse 12-13 reads "Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your hearts, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster."

The prophet Joel is telling the people "Let's go back. Let's return." No, the prophet Joel was not talking about returning to Key West or the Bahamas, he was talking about reuniting with God. For you see, the children of Isreal had wandered from God. They began to worship other gods and idols. And they found out that these false gods could not help them. And so, in desperation, they called out to God to find them and bring them back.

The Good News is this. When we get lost and when we wander away from God, the Holy Spirit invites us to say: "Let's go back." After all, sin leaves us lost and lonely. Thankfully the Holy Spirit calls us to go back to God who loves us and forgives us.

Jesus too taught the same thing as the prophet Joel when He told the story of the prodigal son who wandered from his father. You know how it ends. When the father saw the son coming back home, he ran out to him and welcomed him home with both arms wide open.

Just as it is great to go back to that special place where you enjoyed yourself and yearn to return, it is even better to be welcomed back home by God. And that is why we sing during Lent "Return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." Ash Wednesday this year will be observed on March 5. Come and join us as we return to the Lord at the Ash Wednesday Service. And don't forget Shrove Tuesday. Pancakes, sausage, and King Cake will be served in the Fellowship Hall.

As the words to the Hymn "Softly and Tenderly Jesus is Calling" state: "Come Home, Come Home, you who are weary, come home. Earnestly, tenderly, Jesus is calling, Calling, O sinner, come home."

The Season of Lent calls out to us to "Come Home."

Reconciliation

The work of racial reconciliation

Racial reconciliation isn't a new concept. Some 2,000 years ago, the apostle Philip recognized that a man from Ethiopia was just as worthy of baptism into the body of Christ as were the natives of Judea and Galilee.

In Color-Courageous Discipleship, Michelle T. Sanchez views racial reconciliation as a personal journey for the greater good. "Jesus seeks to bring about the kind of inner transformation we need to

transform our world God's way," she writes. That echoes Martin

Luther King Jr.'s statement: "Only through an inner spiritual transformation do we gain the strength to fight vigorously the evils of the world in a humble and loving spirit" (*Strength to Love*).

On Racial Reconciliation Sunday, observed the second Sunday of February, consider how you can address racial issues. Sanchez suggests simple steps such as starting a conversation with someone of another ethnicity or advocating for a friend. Consider how other people's lives and challenges are different from yours. Pray for people of different races and cultures. Ponder how you can come alongside and walk with them — and they with you.


A note from Rosalee...

He had been very ill for some time with various things. Donnie Steve and I barely got to Tucson to see him his last couple of days and talk to him. "I am here"

In *Bread for the Journey*, theologian Henri J.M. Nouwen calls consolation — from "to be with" (con-) "the lonely one" (solus) — "one of the most important ways to care." He writes, "Life is so full of pain, sadness and loneliness that we often wonder what we can do to alleviate the immense suffering we see."

Although consoling doesn't necessarily remove someone's pain, Nouwen notes that it serves a deeper purpose: To console means "to be there and say, 'You are not alone, I am with you. Together we can carry the burden. Don't be afraid. I am here.' That is consolation. We all need to give it as well as to receive it."




Love makes us worthy

Unlike God, who loves unconditionally, humans often make choices and set limits when doling out affection. But Thomas Merton reminds us, "Our job is to love others without stopping to inquire whether or not they are worthy. That is not our business and, in fact, it is nobody's business. What we are asked to do is to love, and this love itself will render both ourselves and our neighbors worthy."

As for how to develop and maintain that type of love? Merton shares, "It is in deep solitude that I find the gentleness with which I can truly love my neighbors."
